Urinary Symptom Questionnaire for Neurogenic Bladder - Intermittent Catheterization (USQNB - IC)


ACTIONABLE	URINE QUALITY
 □ Feeling feverish □ Increased tone/spasticity (not bladder spasms) □ Bladder spasms frequency/discomfort 	□ Worse-smelling urine□ Darker urine□ Cloudier/ sediment in urine
□ Abdominal/ suprapubic pain□ Dizziness	Total "Urine Quality" Symptoms
 Headache Autonomic Dysreflexia Spinal Cord Injury ONLY Increase in irritability (non-verbal children) Increase in fatigue, lethargy, or weakness (non-verbal children) 	If one or more and no other symptoms, self manage if monitor symptoms
Total "Actionable" Symptoms	CONSTITUTIONAL
If one or more symptoms then consider seeking medical attention for assessment of symptoms	 □ Increase in fatigue, lethargy, or weakness □ Loss of appetite □ Malaise/ feeling unwell
BLADDER	□ Altered sleep patterns □ Muscle aches
 □ Change in quality of pain when passing urine □ Change in quality of pain during catheterization □ Incontinence/ urine leakage 	 □ Increase in positional pain □ Back pain □ Pain in the legs
 □ Urinary urgency □ Increase in catheterization frequency □ Decreased urine volume during catheterization □ Blood in urine 	 Nausea Change in bowel patterns Generalized abdominal discomfort or bloating Irritability, or mental slowing/confusion
Total "Bladder" Symptoms	Total "Constitutional Symptoms
If one or more Bladder AND one or more Actionable, then consider seeking medical attention for UTI assessment	If one or more and no other symptoms then monitor and consider seeking medical assessment

• If four or more then consider seeking medical

• If one to three and no other symptoms, self-manage +
